The main idea of Luke 15:11-32:

The following questions can be used during a family worship time. Take time as a family this week to talk about the Story and what you are learning as you read. The hymns on the next pages are from our worship service. Sing them together as a family during your family worship time this week.

Discussion questions:

What does it mean to you to have a pure heart?

Why did Jesus' teaching bother some of the religious leaders?

Jesus explained that He is the bread of life—the source of sustenance and satisfaction. What can you do to gain a deeper satisfaction in your relationship with Jesus?

What can you learn from Jesus' parables that you can use in your own life?

As a family:

Jesus told stories about a lost coin, a lost sheep, and a lost son. In each case, when the lost thing was found, a celebration followed. The message is this: a person coming to faith in Jesus ignites a great celebration. Plan a party with some Christian friends for the express purpose of celebrating the fact that you are followers of Jesus. Take turns sharing how God brought you to faith and the people he used in the process. You might want to read Luke 15 at the party.
